PHYSICAL LITERACY AT WESTWIND

We will be continuing to ramp up our physical literacy this September. We have our school wide runs three times per week, our Terry Fox Run, and the District Cross Country Running race on the horizon. All students from Kindergarten to grade 7 are expected to jog and/or power walk on our Westwind track in the back field when we go out. We will continue with all our students doing regular school-wide runs all year (weather permitting). Our September training will also be in preparation the District Cross Country Race on October 17th.

SCHOOL-WIDE RUNS

On Mondays, Wednesday and Friday at 1:45pm (when the weather is decent), we'll be heading outside for a jog/power walk. This will no doubt create a solid foundation for our cardiovascular fitness and overall health and wellness. Please make sure that your child has suitable running shoes so they're comfortable being active. There's nothing worse than running 2kms in Hello Kitty rubber boots. We will be running around the 500m track at the back of our school. Our minimum expectation for the primary students (after they've had a chance to train) is that they are able to run one lap of the track without having to stop to walk. For intermediate students (grade 4-7), they're expected to be able to run 2 laps of the track if they want to be considered "proficient."
