Planning for the 2022/23 school year is underway. It is critical that school principals know the number of students who will be attending each school for September 2022 in order to allocate staff and resources for the upcoming year. To this end, parents/legal guardians are asked to complete the information section on the attached form and return it to school office or the teacher of the oldest child in the school by Friday, January 21st.

REPORTING ABSENCES

We understand that we are facing difficult times, and that each family has reasons for the choices that they make. Know that there will be times when staff and students are away. Let's work together to help each other during this difficult time by not making assumptions on why someone is absent. If possible or appropriate for your situation it would be helpful if you could indicate the nature of the illness (for example, tooth ache, chicken pox, or COVID). At the same time, it is important for the school office to know the reason for your absence. Please report your absence by emailing: westwind@sd38.bc.ca or by calling: 604-668-6497. Know that your reasons for your absences will remain confidential. If symptoms continue, please contact your health practitioner or call 811 to obtain medical advice regarding staying home or returning to school.

We know that families are considering having their child stay home for a few days out of concern of COVID and the Omicron variant. We know that it can be difficult to know what to do, and that every family has their own reason or story of why they may keep their child at home. At this time, we are not able to offer online learning, and classroom teachers are not able to provide lesson plans for learning at home.


