#### WHICH HIGH SCHOOL WILL MY GRADE 7 CHILD BE ATTENDING?

Grade 7 students are automatically registered to attend their neighbourhood catchment secondary school based on the current residential address we have on file.

A friendly reminder that if Grade 7 families change their residence, and the address change results in a new secondary school catchment, families will need to complete a Change of Residence Form and return it to the office with proof of the new residence. You are welcome to use this form to change your address and return it to Westwind until Friday, January 31, 2025. If the change of address occurs after that date and it results in a new secondary catchment, families will need to register through Central Registration as part of the Priority 2 or Late Registration protocol.

If you are considering submitting a Transfer Request, the form is currently available on the district website. Completed forms are to be emailed directly to the chosen high school between February 3-28.

#### WESTWIND COMMUNITY FRIDGE

Our Community Fridge has proven very popular, which is great! The fridge allows our school to provide healthy food choices for students who may need an additional snack, or have forgotten their snack, or are still hungry during the day. The aim is to ensure everyone has access to healthy food without barriers or stigma. Students are welcome to make a choice based on what they know they need. This might take some time for learners to understand and we encourage parents to have a chat with their children about when coming to the fridge might be a good choice for them.

Sometimes students need reminders to think about whether they should be accessing the fridge. For example, if students are coming to take a snack before they have eaten the food they brought from home, or if they are taking snacks because they don't like the food they brought from home, they may need to pause and think. This is a good learning opportunity for students to try to understand that they should take what they need when they need it, but they should also be aware that the fridge is there to support others who perhaps don't already have food.

We are grateful for the Feeding Futures program that supplies some of the food offered in our Community Fridge and helps us to enhance student food security at Westwind.
