March 1: Zero Discrimination Day is a UN recognized day to take action to end the inequalities surrounding income, sex, age, health status, occupation, disability, sexual orientation, drug use, gender identity, race, class, ethnicity and religion that continue to persist around the world. Often used to highlight discrimination of people living with HIV.

> March 8: International Women's Day is a time to reflect on progress made, to call for change and to celebrate acts of courage and determination by ordinary women, who have played an extraordinary role in the history of their countries and communities.

March 13 & 14: Purim is a Jewish celebration that is a lively festival that commemorates back in the 4th century BC, when Jewish people were saved from a death decree according to the book of Esther.

March 14: Holi is a Hindu festival that celebrates spring, colour, and love.

March 14-16: Hola Mohalla is a colourful 3-day Sikh festival celebrated during spring.

March 17-23: Neurodiversity Celebration Week - A worldwide initiative that challenges stereotypes and misconceptions about neurodevelempmental disorders and learning disabilities.

March 19-20: Nowruz – Iranian (Persian) New Year is a celebration that marks the end of an old year and the beginning of a new one and is celebrated on the day of the astronomical vernal equinox, which usually takes place on March 21. The celebrations last for 13 days, and it's an opportunity to reflect on the past and set intentions for the future.

March 21: World Down Syndrome Day is a global awareness day which has been observed by the United Nations since 2012. The goal is to help people understand and support those with Down syndrome better. The date being the 21st day of the 3rd month was chosen to represent the triplication (trisomy) of the 21st chromosome which causes Down syndrome.



March 30-31: Eid-al-Fitr

Many Muslims in Canada celebrate Eid al-Fitr on the first day of Shawwal in the Islamic calendar. It marks the end of the month-long fast of Ramadan and the start of a feast that lasts up to three days in some countries. The date is dependent on the sighting of the new crescent moon.

March 30 - April 7: Chaitra Navratri A Hindu nine-day festival to celebrate the first day of the Hindu calendar.
