Parent Input Needed for RSD's 2025–2030 Strategic Plan



As part of the development of the 2025–2030 Strategic Plan, the Richmond School District is seeking input from students, staff, parents/caregivers, partner groups, and the greater Richmond community through a survey. Additionally, there will be four open houses and a virtual session. Feedback gathered will help shape the priorities that will guide the district for the next five years.


Significant Dates in our Community Black History Month: During Black History Month, people in February 2025

Canada celebrate the many achievements and contributions of Black Canadians and their communities who, throughout history, have done so much to make Canada a culturally diverse, compassionate, and prosperous country.



February 26: Maha Shivaratri is one of the major festivals in Hinduism dedicated to worshipping Lord Shiva. People celebrate Maha Shivaratri by fasting, keeping vigil and doing pujas at homes and temples.

February 26: Pink Shirt Day is a student created day in Canada to stand up to homophobic bullying. A video of cofounder of Pink Shirt Day can be found here.



February 28 - March 29: Ramadan is the ninth month of Islamic Lunar calendar. Muslims consider this whole month a blessed month. They fast during the days of this month and make special prayers at night. People also give more charity and do extra righteous deeds.



Who is Eligible?

Children are eligible for coverage if they are:

a) more than 6 months old;
 b) less than 27 years old; and
 c) live in Canada, except the province of Quebec.

If a child is 14 years old or older at any time during the Coverage Period, they must be a full-time student within the 12 months prior to any claim. We defin a full-time student as being enrolled in a minimum of 3 courses at the same time, during any 4-month period.

If you have children enrolled in diffeent school s or school boards, they may all be insured under one policy.
