At Westwind, we are committed to creating balanced classes with learning environments that focus on students' areas of strength and growth. Class placements is a thoughtful, complex, and collaborative process which takes into account individual student needs in regards to academic, social and emotional progress, while aiming to create equitable learning communities for all students within the school. Having balanced classes throughout the school benefits all learners and contributes to having optimal learning environments throughout the school.

There are a number of student and school organizational considerations prior to making a placement decision. As a team of experienced, professional educators, we are sensitive to the needs of each student and we review these factors in an educationally sound manner to ensure the best placement possible for our students within existing school operational resources and constraints.

Student considerations in determining placement include (but are not limited to):

- student learning styles, strengths and needs
- social-emotional strengths and needs
- peers who are a positive influence for student learning
- students who are English language learners
- students who have exceptional needs
- students who are new to the school
- leadership potential
- friendships and potential new friendships

School organizational considerations include:

- creating heterogeneous (mixed ability) class groupings
- creating balanced academic and social/emotional educational classroom settings
- equitable class size and composition assignments as defined by teacher contract

The class placement process is designed to create balanced classrooms and optimal learning environments as much as possible. At the beginning of the year, remember that *all students need the gift of time* to feel settled in their new classes, to bond with their teacher, and to connect with peers in their classes. With support from both home and school, we wish for a great year of learning and growing for every student at Westwind.


