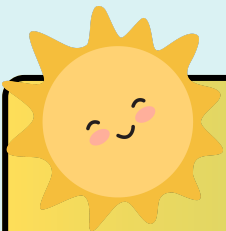

(If these are left at home, our water fountains are fully operational.)

**Air Quality Monitoring:** When smoke from wildfires move into our area, schools are given the tools to monitor the air quality hourly and we will move activities indoors if need be.

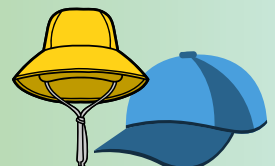

## Medication at School

If your child has a life threatening allergy or a medical condition that requires them to be given prescribed medication at school (e.g. epipens, antibiotics, pills, inhalers), please ensure you complete a “Request for Administration of Prescribed Medication” form and return it, along the medication, to the school office as soon as possible

In accordance with the Richmond School District guidelines for administration of prescribed medications, non-prescription medications such as Tylenol, Advil, Benadryl, etc. will not be administered by school staff and should not be kept at school or in your child’s backpack. If required, please provide such medication at home before coming to school, or, if needed, school staff will call a parent.



## Allergy Alert - No Nuts Please

Please be aware that Westwind school has many students with severe, life-threatening food allergies. Please do not send food to school containing any type of nuts (e.g. no peanut, almond, cashew, pistachio or other nut butters, including Nutella, etc). If using substitutions such as SunButter or Wowbutter, please always label lunch containers, as these products can look and smell just like peanut butter, and this helps teachers and staff ensure safety without confusion. Thank you for working with us to ensure the health and safety of all of our students.

## SCHOOL MESSENGER

If you have not yet signed up to receive text messages from the school and the district, send a text with “Y” to 978338 to opt-in! The district and school will use this to send important text alerts (e.g. snow days). Add this number to your contacts and edit the name to “School Messenger”.

**Our school parking lot is RESERVED for Westwind and District STAFF ONLY.**

Parking spots are not for pick-up/drop-off purposes. Parent volunteers may park in the “Visitor” spots.

**DRIVE-THRU LANE:** Please keep

traffic flowing smoothly by not stopping or blocking other vehicles in this lane.

**DO NOT BLOCK ANY DRIVEWAYS.**

Be kind to others and please do not block our neighbours’ driveways. Bylaw officers may ticket you if parked illegally.

**DROP-OFF / PICK UP ZONE:**

Please stay in your vehicle while waiting. No parking in this lane, please.

**Tips** from experienced parent parkers:

The following viable **parking options** should be considered instead of coming into our parking lot:

- Lapwing Crescent (West of the school)
- Woodpecker Drive (North of the school)
- You can also park on Kingfisher, but please pay attention to the “no parking” signs.

Always follow the rules of the road and remember speed limits during school hours.

# Significant Dates in our Community

September 2025

## September 4/5, 2025 – Mawlid al-Nabi (Islamic)

To our Muslim community members observing Mawlid al-Nabi, we extend warm greetings as you mark the birth of the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him). May this day bring peace, reflection, and blessings to you and your families.

Translation note: Mawlid al-Nabi (Arabic: المولد النبوي) means “Birth of the Prophet”. Pronounced: MAW-lid al-NAH-bee



## September 23/24, 2025 – Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year)

Shanah Tovah! To our Jewish students, staff, and families, we wish you a sweet and meaningful Rosh Hashanah as you welcome the Jewish New Year 5786. May this time of renewal be filled with hope, joy, and connection.

Translation note: Rosh Hashanah (Hebrew: ראש השנה) means “Head of the Year”. Pronounced: ROHSH hah-SHAH-nah Shanah Tovah (שנה טובה) is a traditional greeting meaning “Good Year”.



## September 30, 2025 – National Day for Truth and Reconciliation (Canada)

On September 30, we observe the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, honouring the Survivors of residential schools, their families, and the children who never returned home. As a learning community, we reaffirm our commitment to truth, remembrance, and reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples.

Note: This day is also known as Orange Shirt Day, this is a time for collective reflection and recognition of the message, “Every Child Matters”. **Staff and students are encouraged to wear orange on September 29, 2025 in solidarity.**
